Protecting your personal information

Data collection

Data usage

Data is used to contact supporters and other potential ticket purchasers with details of future concerts and related activities. We are committed to providing clear and open information about how data is used and using data in accordance with the data subject's reasonable expectations. We actively guard against data breaches, storing data in an accountable and responsible manner. We will inform data subjects and the Information Commissioner's Office of any breach should it occur.
